SUBJECT: Conditional Use Permit No. 2018-26: A request by Central California Blood Center to establish a blood bank within an existing 4,660 sq. ft. building in the C-R (Regional Commercial) Zone. The project site is located at 2245 W. Caldwell Avenue (APN: 012-041-040).

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends approval of Resolution No. 2018-53 for Conditional Use Permit No. 2018-26 based on the project's consistency with the policies of the City's General Plan and Zoning Ordinance.

RECOMMENDED MOTION

I move to adopt Resolution No. 2018-53 approving Conditional Use Permit No. 2018-26.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

This request is to establish a blood donation center within an existing 4,660 sq. ft. building, which was formerly occupied by the Central Valley Community Bank. The building has frontage on Caldwell Avenue in an existing shopping center as shown in Exhibit "A". Vehicle access to Caldwell Avenue and shopping center parking are adjacent to the subject building.

The proposed interior tenant improvements include the addition of walls for staging areas, donation stations, and desk space as illustrated in Exhibit "B". The operational statement in Exhibit "C" describes proposed activities to be conducted onsite, which include the collection of blood, platelets, and plasma for distribution to south valley hospitals and twice a day to a Fresno processing center. The facility will average a total of 27 donors a day, with stays lasting a half-hour to two hours depending on the product donated.

There will be six employees at any given time, with one staff member onsite 24 hours a day, seven days a week to respond to hospital requests. The center will operate Monday through Friday, 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. and Saturdays from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. The proposal would represent a relocation of the existing blood center at 1515 S. Mooney Blvd to the new site.

RELATED PLANS & POLICIES

The proposed project is consistent with applicable plans and policies of the General Plan Land Use Element and Zoning Ordinance. Blood donation centers are a conditionally permitted use in the C-R zone with discretionary approval of a Conditional Use Permit, pursuant to Chapter 17.38 of the Zoning Ordinance.

PROJECT EVALUATION

Land Use Compatibility

The blood donation center is a conditionally permitted use within the C-R Zone with approval of a Conditional Use Permit (CUP). The blood donation center will be situated within an existing shopping center, east of a developed residential area. The proposed use will not conflict with surrounding uses given sufficient on-site parking and lack of objectionable activity conducted by the blood donation center use as described in their operational statement. No significant exterior improvements are proposed in conjunction with the blood donation center. If approved, the applicant would need a Building Permit to conduct tenant improvements within the existing building.

Operational Compatibility with the Shopping Center

Per the operational statement, the proposed blood donation center will provide a location for people to donate blood, platelets, and plasma. The proposed use is similar to a medical office with hours consistent with those of the surrounding businesses within the adjacent shopping center. Staff finds that the proposed use has similar operational characteristics to other uses in the shopping center.

Parking and Access

The parking requirement for a blood bank or similar medical use is one stall per 200 square feet of building area (Zoning Ordinance Section 17.34.020). This would put the onsite parking need at 24 stalls for the existing 4,660 sq. ft. building. The blood donation center will make use of 35 adjacent shopping center stalls and four onsite stalls located in the former drive-thru area. This parking field is the same general area that was utilized by the previous bank use. The total combined stalls will meet the required parking need for this project.

The four drive-thru stalls will be used by blood center vehicles for parking and loading and unloading of product. Outside of the above, the existing drive-thru cannot be employed for the blood bank use. Any future use would require Site Plan Review and conformance with the drive-thru standards in Zoning Ordinance Section 17.32.162.

Environmental Review

This project is considered Categorical Exempt under Section 15301 of the Guidelines for the Implementation of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) because the project is proposed within an existing facility. (Categorical Exemption No. 2018-69).

RECOMMENDED FINDINGS

1. That the proposed project will not be detrimental to the public health, safety, or welfare, or materially injurious to properties or improvements in the vicinity.
2. That the proposed conditional use permit is consistent with the policies and intent of the General Plan and Zoning Ordinance. Specifically, the project is consistent with the required findings of Zoning Ordinance Section 17.38.110:
 - a. The proposed location of the conditional use permit is in accordance with the objectives of the Zoning Ordinance and the purposes of the zone in which the site is located.
 - b. The proposed location of the conditional use and the conditions under which it would be operated or maintained will not be detrimental to the public health, safety, or welfare, nor materially injurious to properties or improvements in the vicinity.
3. That project is considered Categorical Exempt under Section 15301 of the Guidelines for the Implementation of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) because the project is proposed within an existing facility. (Categorical Exemption No. 2018-69)

RECOMMENDED CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL

1. That the site will be developed in substantial compliance with the comments and conditions of the Site Plan Review Committee as set forth under Site Plan Review No. 2018-193.
2. That the office be operated in compliance with the site plan, floor plan and operational statement in Exhibits "A" and "B".
3. That substantial changes to the site plan, operational statement or floor plan may require an amendment to this Conditional Use Permit as determined through the Site Plan Review process.
4. That all building signage shall require a separate building permit.
5. That all other federal, state and city codes, ordinances and laws be met.

RELATED PLANS AND POLICIES

Conditional Use Permits

(Section 17.38)

17.38.010 Purposes and powers.

In certain zones conditional uses are permitted subject to the granting of a conditional use permit. Because of their unusual characteristics, conditional uses require special consideration so that they may be located properly with respect to the objectives of the zoning ordinance and with respect to their effects on surrounding properties. In order to achieve these purposes and thus give the zone use regulations the flexibility necessary to achieve the objectives of this title, the planning commission is empowered to grant or deny applications for conditional use permits and to impose reasonable conditions upon the granting of such permits. (Prior code § 7525)

17.38.020 Application procedures.

- A. Application for a conditional use permit shall be made to the planning commission on a form prescribed by the commission which shall include the following data:
1. Name and address of the applicant;
 2. Statement that the applicant is the owner of the property or is the authorized agent of the owner;
 3. Address and legal description of the property;
 4. The application shall be accompanied by such sketches or drawings as may be necessary by the planning division to clearly show the applicant's proposal;
 5. The purposes of the conditional use permit and the general description of the use proposed;
 6. Additional information as required by the historic preservation advisory committee.
- B. The application shall be accompanied by a fee set by resolution of the city council sufficient to cover the cost of handling the application. (Prior code § 7526)

17.38.030 Lapse of conditional use permit.

A conditional use permit shall lapse and shall become void twenty-four (24) months after the date on which it became effective, unless the conditions of the permit allowed a shorter or greater time limit, or unless prior to the expiration of twenty-four (24) months a building permit is issued by the city and construction is commenced and diligently pursued toward completion on the site which was the subject of the permit. A permit may be renewed for an additional period of one year; provided, that prior to the expiration of twenty-four (24) months from the date the permit originally became effective, an application for renewal is filed with the planning commission. The commission may grant or deny an application for renewal of a conditional use permit. In the case of a planned residential development, the recording of a final map and improvements thereto shall be deemed the same as a building permit in relation to this section. (Ord. 2001-13 § 4 (part), 2001: prior code § 7527)

17.38.040 Revocation.

Upon violation of any applicable provision of this title, or, if granted subject to a condition or conditions, upon failure to comply with the condition or conditions, a conditional use permit shall be suspended automatically. The planning commission shall hold a public hearing within sixty (60) days, in accordance with the procedure prescribed in Section 17.38.080, and if not satisfied that the regulation, general provision or condition is being complied with, may revoke the permit or take such action as may be necessary to insure compliance with the regulation, general provision or condition. Appeals of the decision of the planning commission may be made to the city council as provided in Section 17.38.120. (Prior code § 7528)

17.38.050 New application.

Following the denial of a conditional use permit application or the revocation of a conditional use permit, no application for a conditional use permit for the same or substantially the same conditional use on the same or substantially the same site shall be filed within one year from the date of denial or revocation of the permit unless such denial was a denial without prejudice by the planning commission or city council. (Prior code § 7530)

17.38.060 Conditional use permit to run with the land.

A conditional use permit granted pursuant to the provisions of this chapter shall run with the land and shall continue to be valid upon a change of ownership of the site or structure which was the subject of the permit application subject to the provisions of Section 17.38.065. (Prior code § 7531)

17.38.065 Abandonment of conditional use permit.

If the use for which a conditional use permit was approved is discontinued for a period of one hundred eighty (180) days, the use shall be considered abandoned and any future use of the site as a conditional use will require the approval of a new conditional use permit.

17.38.070 Temporary uses or structures.

- A. Conditional use permits for temporary uses or structures may be processed as administrative matters by the city planner and/or planning division staff. However, the city planner may, at his/her discretion, refer such application to the planning commission for consideration.
- B. The city planner and/or planning division staff is authorized to review applications and to issue such temporary permits, subject to the following conditions:
 - 1. Conditional use permits granted pursuant to this section shall be for a fixed period not to exceed thirty (30) days for each temporary use not occupying a structure, including promotional enterprises, or six months for all other uses or structures.
 - 2. Ingress and egress shall be limited to that designated by the planning division. Appropriate directional signing, barricades, fences or landscaping shall be provided where required. A security officer may be required for promotional events.
 - 3. Off-street parking facilities shall be provided on the site of each temporary use as prescribed in Section 17.34.020.
 - 4. Upon termination of the temporary permit, or abandonment of the site, the applicant shall remove all materials and equipment and restore the premises to their original condition.
 - 5. Opening and closing times for promotional enterprises shall coincide with the hours of operation of the sponsoring commercial establishment. Reasonable time limits for other uses may be set by the city planner and planning division staff.
 - 6. Applicants for a temporary conditional use permit shall have all applicable licenses and permits prior to issuance of a conditional use permit.
 - 7. Signing for temporary uses shall be subject to the approval of the city planner.
 - 8. Notwithstanding underlying zoning, temporary conditional use permits may be granted for fruit and vegetable stands on properties primarily within undeveloped agricultural areas. In reviewing applications for such stands, issues of traffic safety and land use compatibility shall be evaluated and mitigation measures and conditions may be imposed to ensure that the stands are built and are operated consistent with appropriate construction standards, vehicular access and off-street parking. All fruits and vegetables sold at such stands shall be grown by the owner/operator or purchased by said party directly from a grower/farmer.

- C. The applicant may appeal an administrative decision to the planning commission. (Ord. 9605 § 30 (part), 1996: prior code § 7532)

17.38.080 Public hearing--Notice.

- A. The planning commission shall hold at least one public hearing on each application for a conditional use permit.
- B. Notice of the public hearing shall be given not less than ten days nor more than thirty (30) days prior to the date of the hearing by mailing a notice of the time and place of the hearing to property owners within three hundred (300) feet of the boundaries of the area occupied or to be occupied by the use which is the subject of the hearing, and by publication in a newspaper of general circulation within the city. (Prior code § 7533)

17.38.090 Investigation and report.

The planning staff shall make an investigation of the application and shall prepare a report thereon which shall be submitted to the planning commission. (Prior code § 7534)

17.38.100 Public hearing--Procedure.

At the public hearing the planning commission shall review the application and the statement and drawing submitted therewith and shall receive pertinent evidence concerning the proposed use and the proposed conditions under which it would be operated or maintained, particularly with respect to the findings prescribed in Section 17.38.110. The planning commission may continue a public hearing from time to time as it deems necessary. (Prior code § 7535)

17.38.110 Action by planning commission.

- A. The planning commission may grant an application for a conditional use permit as requested or in modified form, if, on the basis of the application and the evidence submitted, the commission makes the following findings:
 - 1. That the proposed location of the conditional use is in accordance with the objectives of the zoning ordinance and the purposes of the zone in which the site is located;
 - 2. That the proposed location of the conditional use and the conditions under which it would be operated or maintained will not be detrimental to the public health, safety or welfare, or materially injurious to properties or improvements in the vicinity.
- B. A conditional use permit may be revocable, may be granted for a limited time period, or may be granted subject to such conditions as the commission may prescribe. The commission may grant conditional approval for a permit subject to the effective date of a change of zone or other ordinance amendment.
- C. The commission may deny an application for a conditional use permit. (Prior code § 7536)

17.38.120 Appeal to city council.

The decision of the City planning commission on a conditional use permit shall be subject to the appeal provisions of Section 17.02.145. (Prior code § 7537) (Ord. 2006-18 § 6, 2007)

17.38.130 Effective date of conditional use permit.

A conditional use permit shall become effective immediately when granted or affirmed by the council, or upon the sixth working day following the granting of the conditional use permit by the planning commission if no appeal has been filed. (Prior code § 7539)

RESOLUTION NO. 2018-53

A RESOLUTION OF THE PLANNING COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF VISALIA APPROVING CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT NO. 2018-26, A REQUEST BY CENTRAL CALIFORNIA BLOOD CENTER TO ESTABLISH A BLOOD BANK IN THE REGIONAL COMMERCIAL (C-R) ZONE. THE SUBJECT SITE IS LOCATED AT 2245 W. CALDWELL AVENUE (APN: 012-041-040).

WHEREAS, Conditional Use Permit No. 2018-26, is a request by Central California Blood Center to establish a blood bank in the Regional Commercial (C-R) zone. The subject site is located at 2245 W. Caldwell Avenue (APN: 012-041-040); and

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission of the City of Visalia, after duly published notice did hold a public hearing before said Commission on December 10, 2018; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission of the City of Visalia finds the Conditional Use Permit to be in accordance with Chapter 17.38.110 of the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Visalia based on the evidence contained in the staff report and testimony presented at the public hearing; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission finds the project to be Categorically Exempt consistent with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and City of Visalia Environmental Guidelines.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the project is exempt from further environmental review pursuant to CEQA Section 15301.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Planning Commission of the City of Visalia makes the following specific findings based on the evidence presented:

1. That the proposed project, as conditioned, will not be detrimental to the public health, safety, or welfare, or materially injurious to properties or improvements in the vicinity.
2. That the proposed conditional use permit is consistent with the policies and intent of the General Plan and Zoning Ordinance. Specifically, the project is consistent with the required findings of Zoning Ordinance Section 17.38.110:
 - a. The proposed location of the conditional use permit is in accordance with the objectives of the Zoning Ordinance and the purposes of the zone in which the site is located.
 - b. The proposed location of the conditional use and the conditions under which it would be operated or maintained will not be detrimental to the public health, safety, or welfare, nor materially injurious to properties or improvements in the vicinity.

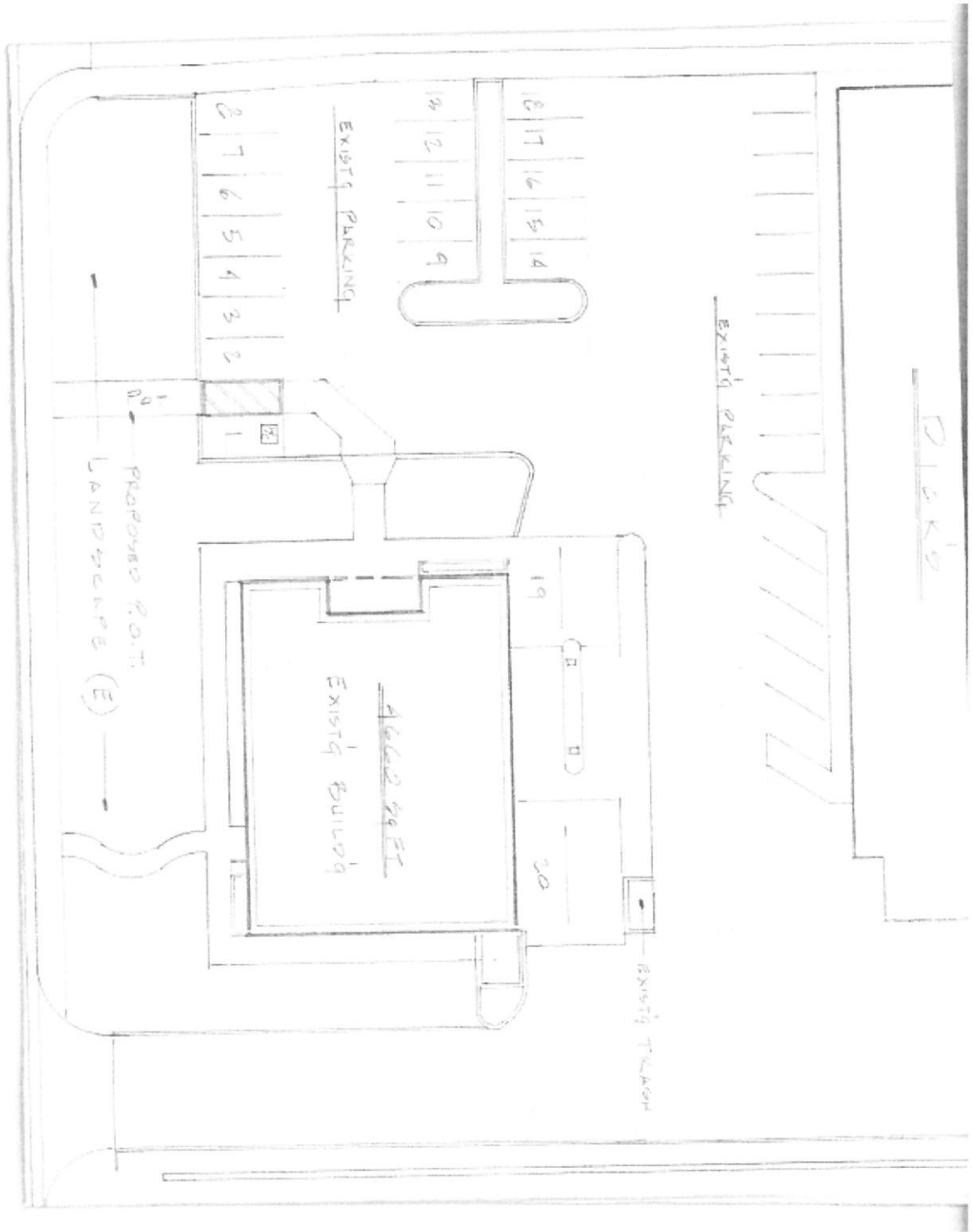

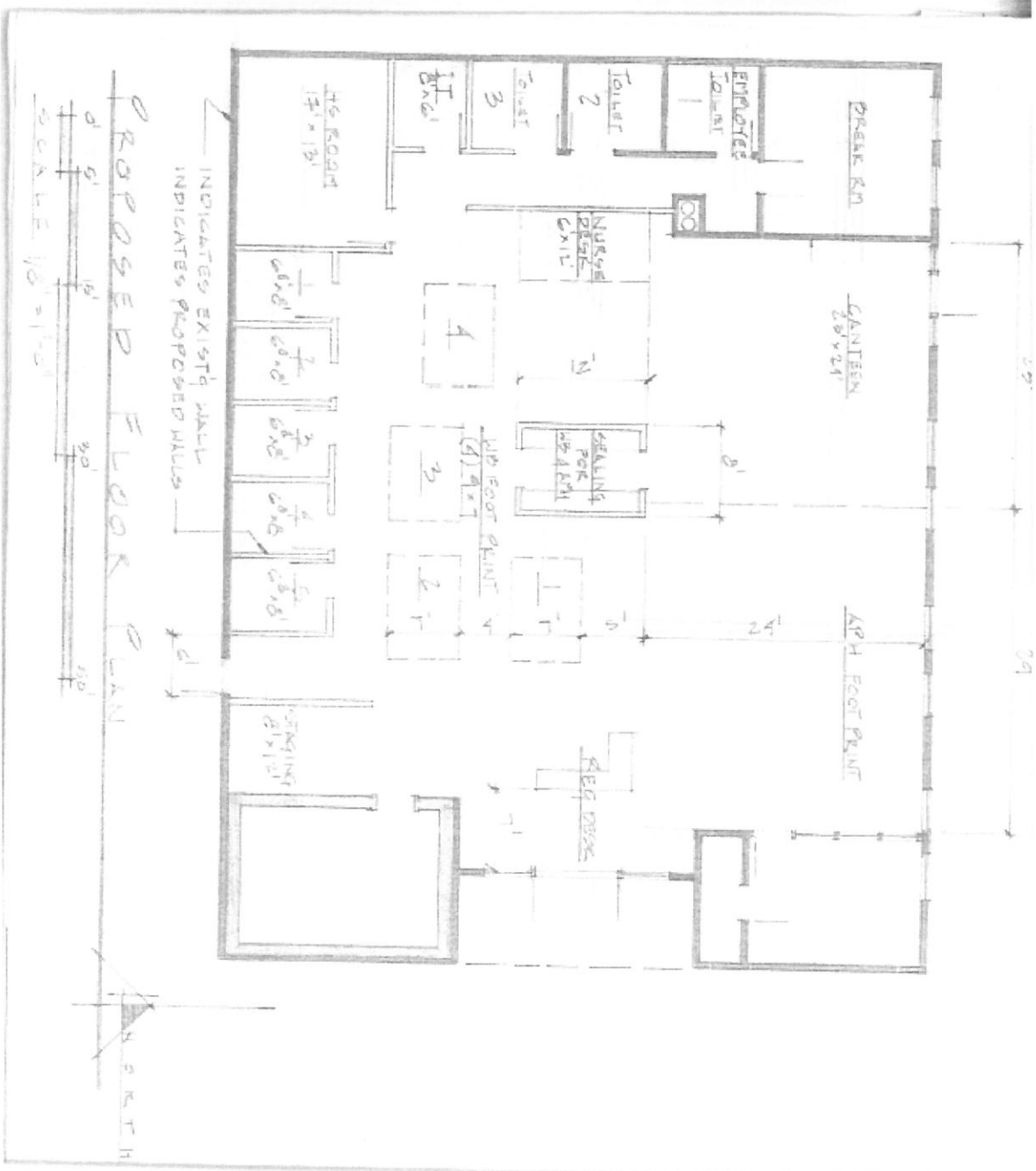

Operational Statement prepared for City of Visalia

The Central California Blood Center is committed to saving lives and improving patient care by providing a safe and abundant blood supply for the patients and families in the communities we serve.

We continue serving our region with excellence and innovation, since 1954. We are the only blood collector/provider in our vast Central Valley region, providing exclusive 24/7 blood products and services to the hospitals in the south valley.

The Visalia Donor Center (VDC) will provide a location for donors to donate whole blood, platelets, and plasma. With a staff of 6, VDC's hours of operation will be Monday through Friday 9:00 am to 6:00 pm and Saturday 9:00 am to 3:00 pm. Products drawn at VDC are sent to our Fresno center for processing. In addition to drawing blood & blood products this location is also a distribution center to hospitals located in the south valley (distributing blood & blood products).

An average of 22 Whole Blood Donors and 5 Apheresis donors donate each day (with the exception of Sunday). A Whole Blood Donation takes an average of thirty minutes and an Apheresis Donation takes an average of two hours. When donors arrive they register at the front desk, are taken to screening booths, from there they go to either a Whole Blood station or an Apheresis station, and once they have completed the donation process are directed to the Canteen area where they hydrate and have a snack during the "recovery" period. There are two Signature Drives that may increase the donor flow, 9-11 (September Drive) and Raider Nation (October drive). Products drawn are sent to our main facility in Fresno twice a day for processing.

Our Hospital Services department has one staff member on site 24 hours a day-7 days a week to respond to orders placed by hospitals for product.

Here in the Central Valley, we're proud of a way of life where we've always taken care of our own. Whether it's for a family member, a neighbor, a stranger, or even yourself, we all need a safe, fresh, ready supply of locally donated blood.

Valley people need valley blood. Together, life flows from here.

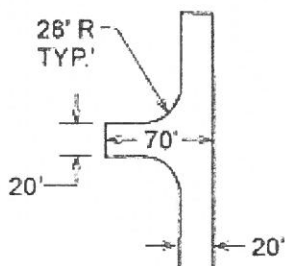

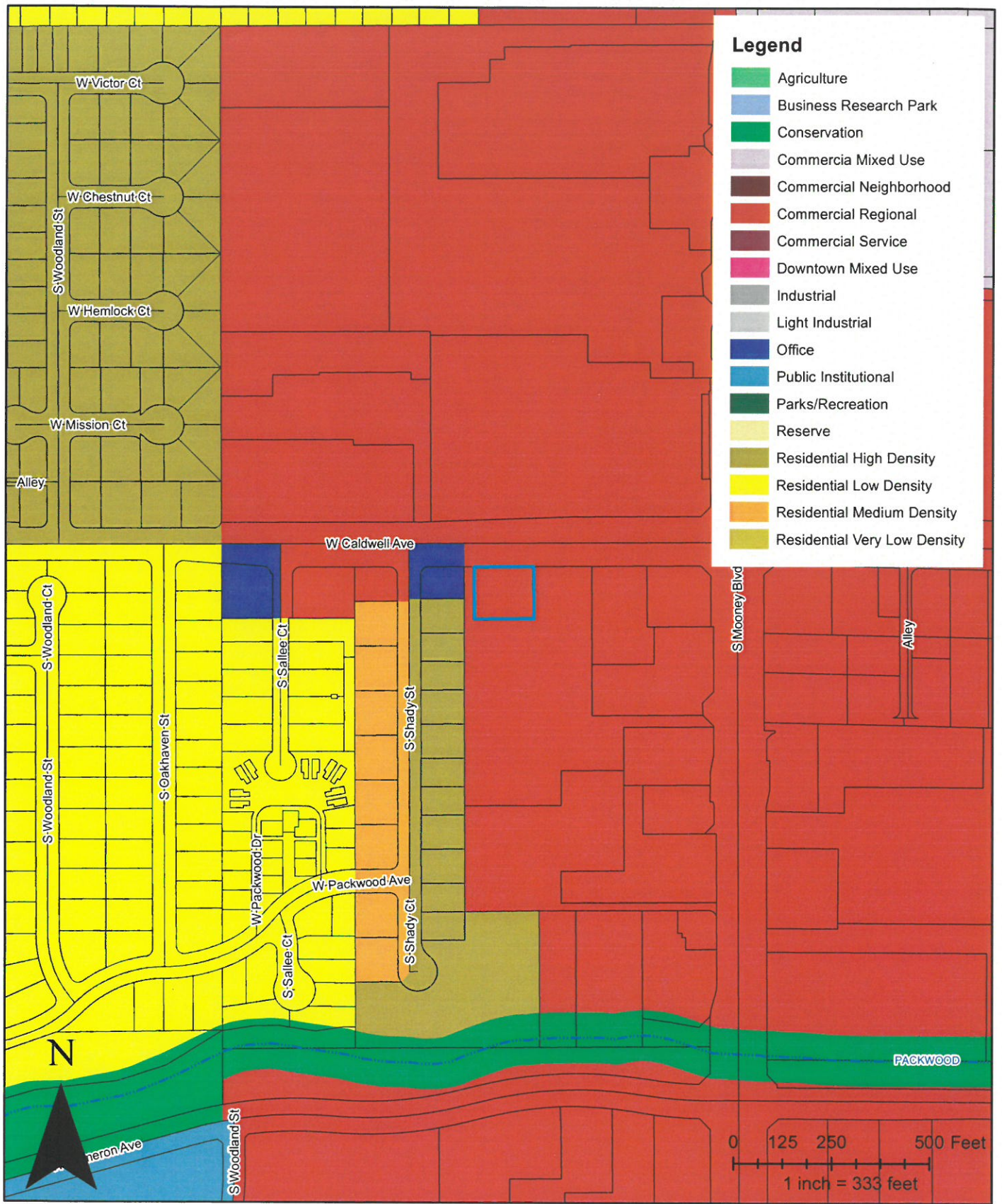

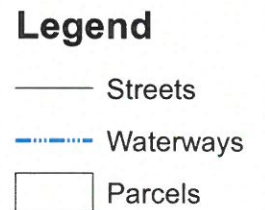
Roll off compactor's must have a clearance of 3 feet from any wall on both sides and there must be a minimum of 53 feet clearance in front of the compactor to allow the truck enough room to provide service.

City ordinance 8.28.120-130 (effective 07/19/18) requires contractor to contract with City for removal of construction debris unless transported in equipment owned by contractor or unless contracting with a franchise permittee for removal of debris utilizing roll-off boxes.

GENERAL PLAN MAP

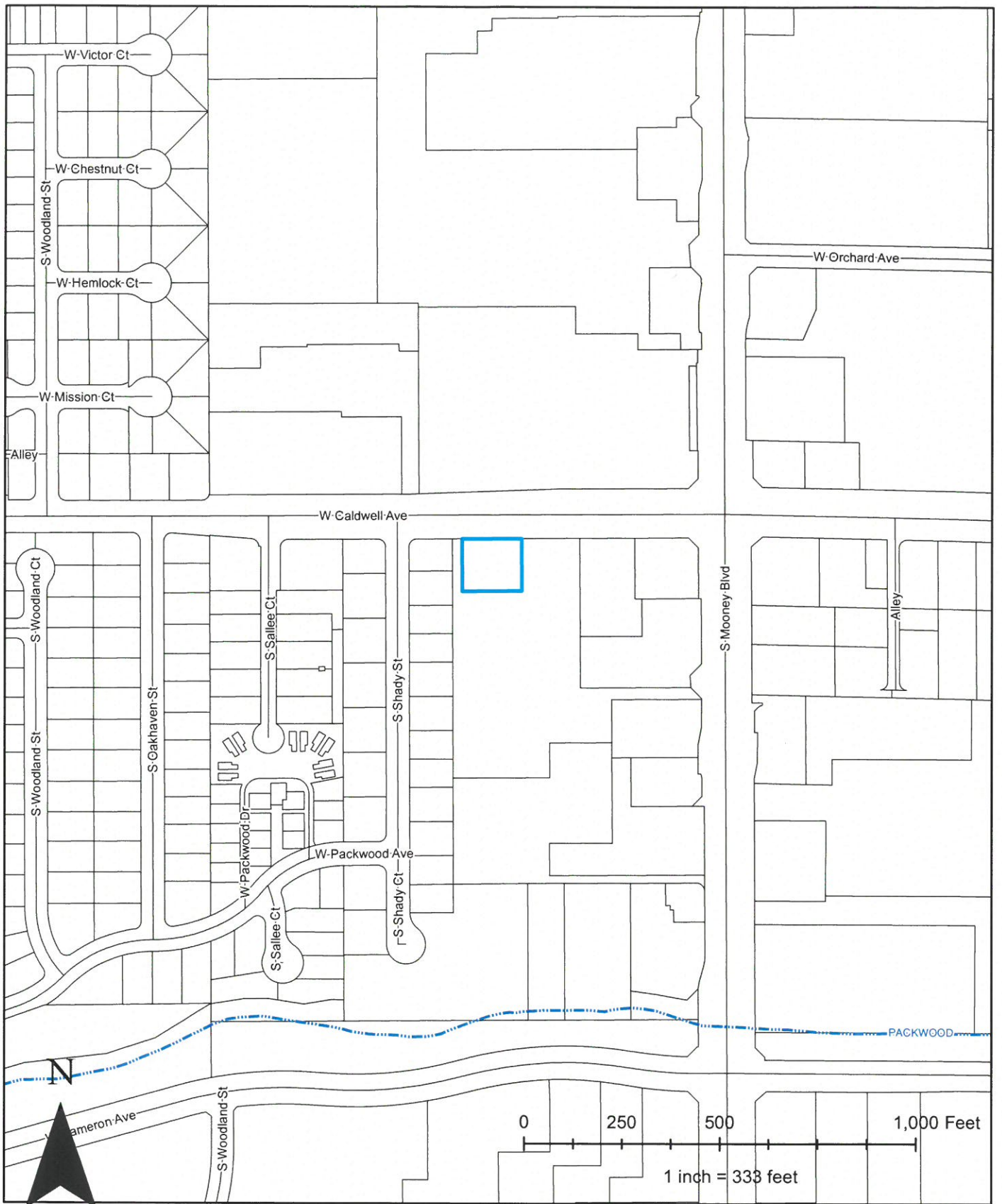




AERIAL MAP
