- 5. Committee and Staff Comments
 - a. Project Updates

Staff provided an update on the Planning Commission's recommendation to the City Council to approve changes for accessory dwelling unit ordinance (ADU) and the adoption of residential design guidelines. Staff stated that changes proposed in the residential design guidelines would have potential to affect the HPAC's ability to conduct design review for new residential proposed in the Historic District. After discussion staff stated they would draft a letter for signature by Davis, providing comment to the City Council, recommending changes to the ADU ordinance and residential design guidelines.

Staff informed the Committee that the latest version of the City of Visalia Winter Recreational Guide contained an ad for the HPAC. Discussion followed, with the Committee extending its thanks to Assistant Planner Colleen Moreno, the staffer who suggested the ad.

Tomola requested staff research whether a \$10,000 pot of funding was still available for City Commissions and Committees to use for projects. Staff stated they would inquire.
